PRESIDENTS REPORT

Introduction

What a great feeling to get an entire season of hockey, both local and representative, completed in the post-COVID era. Once again it gives me great pleasure to lead this fantastic Regional Sporting Organisation. I am proud of the achievements that we as an association have made on the whole over 2022 and I'm especially proud of all our representative players, coaches and officials that have gone on to represent PMHHA at state, national and international events: particularly in this post-COVID era.

Whilst our numbers remained down slightly, this was and is typical across all sports in the post-COVID era as people get their confidence back in the world. Research suggests that people are now used to "solo" sports and are realising that they don't have to compete in team sports to remain fit and active. It will be a challenge not just for us as a sport, but organised teams' sports in general to re-build to the pre-covid player numbers.

Nevertheless, PMHHA managed to field 3 Grades of Senior Hockey, 4 Grades and minkeys of Junior Hockey and entered a record 5 teams into the Mid North Coast Hockey League.

As noted above, Rod Winterton resigned his position from PMHHA Committee. Rod has served PMHHA in a volunteer capacity over many roles for nearly 13 years. Of recent note, he has been instrumental in formulating our operational budgets, streamlining our finances, and providing the sensible voice of reason in the decision-making process. Rod has also been a strong supporter of our recent push to upgrade the facilities and played a major role in grant applications, strategic planning, and grant administration and acquittal. Without his efforts, PMHHA would be in a lesser place than it is today. I'm sure that I speak on behalf of the entire memberships when I pass on my heartfelt thanks to Rod and wish him well as "just a player" in the future years – THANKS.

Successes & Season 2022

Season 2022 was a success on many levels, not least of which was being able to play a full season!

To start the season off – it was pleasing to see PMHHA take home the Hockey NSW award for best branding and social media presence across the state at the annual Hockey NSW awards night. The amazing work done by Ali Hudson via Facebook, Instagram and our Web-site has been used as the benchmark across the states Hockey Associations.

PMHHA presented 3 x Senior Grades in a male and female-based competition, along with 2 competitive juniors' grades (Over & Under 13s), non-competitive under 11's and Under 9s along with a hugely successfully Minkeys programme that has extended right through to Term 4. All these Juniors grades are mixed gender, played at the same time, same fields, and in all but the most extremes of weather. It was also pleasing to see the Member Clubs reach out to each other to trial a combined clubs training model on Saturday mornings across the Minkeys and 7's age groups. The also combined to further foster the combined junior learner umpiring programme for those kids with a keen interest.

Given the uncertainties still in existence at the start of the 2022 season, PMHHA Committee made a conscious effort to keep the playing rules as relaxed as possible to encourage participation and enjoyment. Given the full season, the feedback is overwhelmingly clear that the time is right to strengthen and enforce the playing rules more vigorously moving into 2023, as this certainty provides clarity and an even playing field now that the COVID era is somewhat behind us.

PMHHA were fortunate enough to host several games of the Mid-North Coast Hockey League with both the Tacking Point Thunder and Camden Haven Hockey Clubs competing in both the Men's and

Women's league, along with a highly competitive Port City Hockey Club added to the mix in the men's Competition.

What was even more pleasing, was to see the Men's Tacking Point 'Thunder n Lightning' Team AND the Women's Camden Haven Cobra's team winning these competitions respectively. It's a great result after so many years of trying to bring not one but two of these trophies home to Port Macquarie. A huge well done to both teams.

PMHHA enjoyed similar success throughout our Representative Teams and players with the Div 4, PMHHA No., 2's Under 18 Girls winning gold at the state championships. Again, well done to this team. More successes are listed under the Representative Category below.

Grants and Upgrades

The construction of the clubhouse and carpark project is an on-going plight with countless delays, weather interruptions and a myriad of other things. As your president, I continue to push hard for completion and continue to work in with the project managers and the rest of the committee to get these works completed.

On the plus side, PMHHA were granted Interim Occupation Certificate meaning we finally have access to the clubhouse. We were lucky enough to enjoy the last few weeks of Season 22 in our new clubhouse.

At the time of writing, the estimates are that the Carpark will be completed prior to Christmas 2022.

PMHHA have been receiving steady stream of income from the Federal Government as part of the grant package towards the build of these facilities. More information can be found in the financial reports

On the grant front, PMHHA Committee continue to be successful on the grant front with several wins throughout the season including;

- NAB Grant - \$1,000 (NAB Super Nines)









Finances

Our finances remain relatively strong despite construction cost overruns, but at the same time, PMHHA have been extremely successful in obtaining grants during 2022. Similarly, to come out of the COVID era as strong as we have is a credit to all that contribute and manage our finances.

At the time of writing (end Nov 2022) PMHHA have approx. \$392,000.00 in the bank.

I encourage you all to read over the financial statements in Part 3 of this report including the external auditors' reports. These statements give a clear breakdown of our income and expense, profit and losses and a range of other pertinent information.

PMHHA maintains a robust operational budget as well as strategic budget and if it wasn't for this, we wouldn't be able to afford capital purchases such as new goals, scoreboards, and other peripheral clubhouse purchases. Moving into 2023, much of the ground maintenance and cleaning will be subcontracted out to local providers and it is thanks to our budgeting mechanisms that these contractors can be engaged. New changerooms were placed on order throughout 2022 using the NSW Govt Category 3 Club Grant that we were successful in obtaining.

It is important to note, that the Committee try to budget for at least \$50,000 every year to be invested into our capital works account or "sinking fund". This "sinking fund" is designed to assist us maintain, replace, and improve our facility and the Committee decided in 2022 to withdraw \$150,000.00 from this account to assist in the facility upgrades.

Given the current raft of upgrades including the second field, the clubhouse and carparking, field lighting and the like, it is imperative that the annual amount invested into this fund be increased in-line with the facility upgrades.

It would be remiss of me to not mention our hard-working Committee and other volunteers that make our sport what it is. A huge thanks to my fellow office bearers Graeme Ferguson & Rod Winterton (pre-resignation) for all you do and have done; the conversations, the arguments, the direction we provide each other, and for your dedication to our sport. To the Ordinary Members of PMHHA; Ashley Grummitt, Jeff Maker, Lou Currey and Tracy Holmes, a massive thanks to you all for supporting hockey

locally in the way you do via committing to and volunteering to be part of PMHHA Management Committee. FINANCIAL POSITION

As at the end of the 2022 Hockey Financial Year, PMHHA had in the bank, across all accounts, approximately \$392,000. This healthy figure is attributable to several grant wins over the 2022 year. There is still approximately \$200,000 on Grant funding yet to be paid to PMHHA. This funding is expected in 2023 as and when the various grants end.

PMHHA has no outstanding loans or debts of significance; however, it is noted that there are still significant works to be undertaken to finish the facility upgrades.

The last two junior seasons were hobbled together but thankfully all clubs contributed and ensured that we did the best we could with what we had in terms of delivering a product for the juniors.

Thanks to the Association, there is a renewed focus and attention on both the structure and coordination of junior hockey for 2023 which should have some positive tangible results.

Masters Hockey

After a number of members coming back from the Central Coast Masters recently it has been widely discussed that we would like to see two things happen going forward:

1. Introduce some form of masters / social hockey locally to encourage more "of age" players to get to know each other in a less competitive hockey environment whilst developing those conversations around forming teams each season to take players to Masters' Competitions.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Port Macquarie Hastings Hockey Association Inc For the year ended 30 September 2022

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity. The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements:

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is initially recorded at the cost of acquisition or fair value less, if applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The depreciable amount of all Property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

These notes should be read in conjunction with the attached compilation report.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

Other

We have not been made aware of any mortgages, charges or any other securities affecting any property owned by the association.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company that remain unpaid at 30 September 2022. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

Prepayments

We have been advised of prior period overpayments of water rates to Port Macquarie Hastings Council. This amount has been recognised on the balance sheet as a prepayment, and taken up as an adjustment to the retained earnings account.

Retained Earnings Adjustments

There has been an adjustment to the retained earnings account totalling \$11,778.02. This is due to a \$522.44 adjustment to take up a prepayment as a result of overpaid water rates in prior years and an \$11,255.58 adjustment to depreciation due to depreciation rate changes.
